Pretzels have a long Catholic history. Though the exact origins of the pretzel remains mysterious, legend has it that the story began around A.D. 610, when Italian monks presented their young students with treats of baked dough twisted in the shape crossed arms. At that time, crossing one's arms was the traditional posture for prayer. As the custom spread through medieval Europe, the three holes came to represent the Holy Trinity – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Pretzels were also used as a mainstay of people's diet during Lent.
