



TODAY'S gospel is long but interesting. It is Easter Sunday, the day of the Resurrection of the Lord. Two of Jesus' disciples are leaving the city of Jerusalem to go to the city of Emmaus. As they were walking along, Jesus joined them but they did not know it was Jesus. He asked them why they were so sad and they told him what had happened to Jesus and that the same morning, the women had gone to the tomb and Jesus' body was gone and they said they saw angels who told them that Jesus was alive. Then as they walked together, Jesus explained to them everything that was written about him in the Scriptures. When they arrived at Emmaus, they invited Jesus to stay with them. When Jesus blessed the bread, broke it and gave it to them, they suddenly knew it was Jesus and he disappeared from their sight. They immediately returned to Jerusalem to tell the Apostles.
